# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Transportation – Highway Construction Training and Supportive Services

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (A) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL USE THE MAXIMUM FEASIBLE 6 AMOUNT OF FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE TO THE STATE UNDER 23 U.S.C. § 7 140(B) TO DEVELOP, CONDUCT, AND ADMINISTER HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION 8 TRAINING AND SUPPORTIVE SERVICES, INCLUDING SKILL IMPROVEMENT 9 PROGRAMS.

BY FEBRUARY 1 EACH YEAR, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL 10 **(B)** (1) SUBMIT TO THE SENATE BUDGET AND TAXATION COMMITTEE, SENATE 11 FINANCE COMMITTEE, HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE, AND HOUSE 1213COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, A REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION'S 14COMPLIANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION WITH RESPECT TO EACH 1516 OF THE 2 PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEARS.

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- (2) THE REPORT SHALL:

18 (I) DESCRIBE THE HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION TRAINING, 19 SUPPORTIVE SERVICES, AND SKILL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS THE 20 ADMINISTRATION HAS CONDUCTED AND ADMINISTERED;

(II) ANALYZE THE RESULTS OF THE TRAINING PROGRAMS;

22 (III) STATE THE AMOUNT OF FEDERAL FUNDS AVAILABLE TO 23 THE STATE UNDER 23 U.S.C. § 140(B); AND

24(IV) IDENTIFYTHEAMOUNTSPENTBYTHE25ADMINISTRATION IN CONDUCTING AND ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAMS.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2012.

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
