- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 (a) Each pest control consultant, pest control applicator, or public agency 20 applicator shall obtain an annual certificate indicating competence in one or more 21 established categories from the Secretary. Each private applicator shall obtain a 22 certificate which shall require periodic renewal as determined by the Secretary.
- 23 (b) Each application for a certificate by a pest control consultant or pest control applicator shall be accompanied by a \$75 certificate fee plus \$25 for each

category in excess of one. Each application for a private applicator certificate shall be accompanied by a fee of \$7.

- 10 **(2) (I)** Each applicant for a private applicator certificate shall pass 11 an examination given by the Department.
- 12 **(II)** A private applicator certificate is valid for 3 years and may 13 be renewed by the certificate holder by participation in training approved by the 14 Department.
- 15 (3) (I) EACH APPLICATION FOR A PEST CONTROL CONSULTANT
 16 CERTIFICATE, PEST CONTROL APPLICATOR CERTIFICATE, PUBLIC AGENCY
 17 APPLICATOR CERTIFICATE, OR PRIVATE APPLICATOR CERTIFICATE SHALL BE

- 1 Each certificate shall be renewed upon payment of the certificate fee and (d) 2 demonstration of satisfactory knowledge of pesticide use. 3 Each place of business engaged in the business of conducting pest control shall obtain an annual license indicating the category of operation. 4 5 Each place of business engaged in the business of pest control or pest 6 control consulting shall pay to the Department an annual license fee of \$150 and shall 7 provide evidence of financial responsibility as required by the Department. 8 (g) Each license shall be renewed upon payment of the license fee and 9 submission of proof of liability insurance. 10 (h) A person who sells or distributes a restricted use pesticide shall hold a dealer permit from the Secretary. 11 12 (1) Each application for a dealer permit shall be accompanied by a \$25 13 permit fee. Each dealer permit shall be renewed annually upon payment of the 14 (2)15 permit fee. 16 **(3) (I)** EACH APPLICATION FOR A DEALER PERMIT SHALL BE 17 ACCOMPANIED BY A CERTIFIED POLICE AND FEDERAL AGENCY BACKGROUND 18 CHECK. 19 (II)THE BACKGROUND CHECK SHALL VERIFY THAT THE 20 **APPLICANT:** IS NOT LISTED ON THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF 211. 22INVESTIGATION'S TERRORIST SCREENING DATABASE; AND 2. 23 DOES NOT HAVE A DOCUMENTED CRIMINAL 24HISTORY THAT WOULD INCREASE THE POTENTIAL FOR PURCHASING, 25POSSESSING, TRANSFERRING, OR SELLING PESTICIDES THAT COULD BE USED IN 26A CRIMINAL MANNER TO OTHER PERSONS. 27 (III) THE DEPARTMENT MAY CHARGE A REASONABLE FEE 28FOR THE BACKGROUND CHECK IF THE DEPARTMENT:
- 29 1. CONDUCTS THE BACKGROUND CHECK; OR
- 2. CONTRACTS FOR A THIRD PARTY TO CONDUCT THE BACKGROUND CHECK.

SENATE BILL 888

- 1 (i) A public agency that applies a pesticide shall hold an annual public agency permit from the Secretary.
 - (j) (1) Any person who operates a pest control business shall register annually with the Department each employee, other than a certified applicator, who offers or performs pest control at each business location.
 - (2) The application fee to register an employee initially is \$30.
 - (3) The annual renewal fee to register an employee is \$30.
 - (k) If an application for renewal of a license, certificate, or registration is received by the Department more than 30 days after the expiration of the license, certificate, or registration, the applicant is subject to a \$30 late fee.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
