1 CONJUNCTION WITH TESTING, OF SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS COMPATIBLE WITH 2 ACUTE OR LATE-STAGE LYME DISEASE OR POST-TREATMENT LYME DISEASE 3 SYNDROME; OR

4 (II) THE OBSERVATION OF SURVEILLANCE CRITERIA SET 5 FORTH BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.

6 (3) "LYME DISEASE" MEANS AN ACUTE OR LATE-STAGE 7 INFECTION WITH BORRELIA BURGDORFERI AS DETERMINED BY CLINICAL 8 DIAGNOSIS MADE BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN.

9 (4) "POST-TREATMENT LYME DISEASE SYNDROME" MEANS THE 10 LINGERING SYMPTOMS OF FATIGUE, PAIN, OR JOINT AND MUSCLE ACHES THAT 11 CONTINUE AFTER A PATIENT IS TREATED FOR LYME DISEASE.

12 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND MAKE AVAILABLE TO 13 LICENSED PHYSICIANS A PATIENT INFORMATION SHEET ON LYME DISEASE 14 THAT INCLUDES:

15 (1) THE SYMPTOMS OF LYME DISEASE AND POST-TREATMENT 16 LYME DISEASE SYNDROME RECOGNIZED BY THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE 17 CONTROL AND PREVENTION;

A NOTIFICATION THAT:

19(I)LABORATORY TESTS FOR LYME DISEASE MAY GIVE A20FALSE NEGATIVE RESULT; AND

(II) IF A LABORATORY TEST GIVES A NEGATIVE RESULT,
THE PATIENT SHOULD BE RETESTED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE PATIENT'S
PHYSICIAN; AND

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(3) A STATEMENT THAT INFORMS THE PATIENT THAT:

25(I) INFORMATION REGARDING LYME DISEASE IS26INCOMPLETE AND REMAINS MEDICALLY UNCERTAIN; AND

(II) THAT THERE IS NO TREATMENT FOR POST-TREATMENT
LYME DISEASE SYNDROME THAT HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD
AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION.

1 (C) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN MAY GIVE THE INFORMATION SHEET 2 DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION TO EACH PATIENT WHO 3 IS TESTED FOR LYME DISEASE.

4 (D) A LABORATORY TEST THAT GIVES A NEGATIVE RESULT FOR LYME 5 DISEASE OR POST-TREATMENT LYME DISEASE SYNDROME MAY NOT BE 6 ADMITTED, AS EVIDENCE THAT A PATIENT DOES NOT HAVE LYME DISEASE OR 7 POST-TREATMENT LYME DISEASE SYNDROME, IN:

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- (1) A COURT PROCEEDING IN THE STATE;

9 (2) A PROCEEDING REGARDING THE DENIAL OF INSURANCE 10 BENEFITS; OR

- 11 (3) A STATE BOARD OF PHYSICIANS DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDING.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2012.
