## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Child in Need of Supervision Pilot Program – Funding**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to include a certain General Fund  
4 appropriation in the budget bills for certain fiscal years to be provided as grants  
5 to Cecil County, Montgomery County, and Prince George’s County to implement  
6 the expansion of the Child in Need of Supervision Pilot Program; making this  
7 Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Child in Need of  
8 Supervision Pilot Program.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
10 Chapter 382 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2011  
11 Section 2

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Chapter 382 of the Acts of 2011**

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor [may]  
16 **SHALL** include a General Fund appropriation of \$250,000 for the Department of  
17 Juvenile Services in [the] **EACH** budget bill for fiscal year [2013] **2014 AND FISCAL**  
18 **YEAR 2015** for the purpose of implementing the provisions of Section 1 of this Act. Of  
19 the \$250,000, \$100,000 shall be provided as a grant to Prince George’s County,  
20 \$100,000 shall be provided as a grant to Montgomery County, and \$50,000 shall be  
21 provided as a grant to Cecil County for the purpose of implementing the provisions of  
22 Section 1 of this Act.

1           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency  
2 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,  
3 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members  
4 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from  
5 the date it is enacted.
