A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Construction Debris and Demolition Debris – Recycling**
3 **Lumber**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a certain facility to accept for recycling certain
5 construction debris and demolition debris that contain lumber under certain
6 circumstances; prohibiting a certain facility from recycling certain construction
7 debris and demolition debris if the debris contains asbestos; providing for the
8 application of this Act; defining a certain term; and generally relating to
9 recycling construction debris and demolition debris in Baltimore City.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Environment**

18 **9–258.**

19 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “FACILITY” MEANS A RUBBLE LANDFILL OR ANY**
20 **OTHER SOLID WASTE ACCEPTANCE FACILITY.**

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 **(B) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO A FACILITY LOCATED IN BALTIMORE**
2 **CITY THAT ACCEPTS CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS FOR**
3 **RECYCLING.**

4 **(C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
5 **SUBSECTION, A FACILITY SHALL ACCEPT FOR RECYCLING CONSTRUCTION**
6 **DEBRIS AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS THAT CONTAIN A MIXTURE OF CONCRETE,**
7 **BRICK, AND LUMBER IF THE LUMBER DOES NOT EXCEED 10% BY VOLUME OF**
8 **THE MIXTURE.**

9 **(2) A FACILITY MAY NOT ACCEPT A MIXTURE OF CONCRETE,**
10 **BRICK, AND LUMBER FOR RECYCLING IF THE MIXTURE CONTAINS ASBESTOS.**

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2012.
