FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 90 (Baltimore County Delegation)

Ways and Means Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Election Law - Baltimore County Republican Party Central Committee - Election of Chairman

This bill requires that the chairman of the Baltimore County Republican Party Central Committee be elected by the members of the central committee from among its members and in accordance with its bylaws, rather than being elected at large by the voters.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. The bill does not impact Baltimore County finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Baltimore County Republican Party Central Committee consists of four members elected from each councilmanic district in the county and a chairman elected from the county at large. Aside from the Baltimore County Republican Party Central Committee, the chairmen of other county central committees are selected by the committees.

Background: Each political party must have a State central committee, which is the governing body of the political party, and central committees may be formed for each county. A State central committee may be composed of the members of the county central committees during their terms in office. The Democratic and Republican parties each have a State central committee (consisting of the members of the county central

committees) and 24 county central committees. The county central committees of the Democratic and Republican parties are elected during the gubernatorial primary.
