Below is a description of each project that will be undertaken:- First and second floor bath remodels to bring toilets and sinks to ADA standards. Installation of grab bars. Floors damaged from prior leaks will be replaced.- Installation of new fuel efficient furnace.- Repair of 36" wide by 8" deep pot hole on parking lot (hazard to clients and personnel). Application of oil based sealer to parking lot, paint new parking lines and markings.- Replacement of existing hazardous brick and cement steps, installation of new cement walkway connecting parking lot to front entrance (replacing crumbling asphalt) and aluminum stair rails.- Front porch repairs include replacement of broken siding tile, painting of knee wall, door frame and porch floor. Replacement of broken lattice panels with new panel.- Handicapped entrance ramp, currently constructed of splintering pressure treated lumber will be replaced with composite deck boards, ramp risers, and rails.- Chimney repair to include installation of stainless steel liner the length of gas flue, pointing of bricks, installation of top plate and collar and stainless steel cap.

Community Education Workshops. EEG Biofeedback (Neurofeedback) "Brain Training" . "Sociabilities" social skills groups for children and their parents. Parenting Groups and programs. Information and Referral Services, including substance abuse information and assessments. Consultations with other child and family serving agencies. Children in Crisis:Lighthouse provides counseling and other services to children and their families who are experiencing a crisis. Such crises include children who are victims of physical, sexual and/or emotional abuse, children who have witnessed severe domestic violence in the home, including children who have witnessed the murder or assault of a family member, children who are suicidal, children who have been or are about to be expelled from school, or children who are homeless or about to become homeless. Children in crisis are a highly vulnerable population whose numbers in our community have increased dramatically. Lighthouse aims to prevent such negative consequence as death, injury, suicide, expulsion and entry into the criminal justice system. The nation's continuing economic problems mean more and more families need our services - while our major grants have been reduced. Lighthouse's mission is to help families find hope and build a positive future. Now more then ever children and their families need affordable, accessible help so that every child and parent who needs our assistance can get it before problems become crises or even tragedies. We charge extremely reasonable fees for all of our services, as many as 15% of our clients are not able to pay these fees.
