10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)					
<p>Incorporated in 1902 and at the same location. Mission:Provide Fire,Rescue and Emergency Medical Services to our immediate community, Baltimore County and adjacent jurisdictions (Baltimore City, Anne Arundel County and Howard County. We also manage a youth community program (Fire Cadets). A new facility is needed to provide adequate space for training, storage of vehicles and equipment,sufficient facilities for personal hygiene and sleeping quarters as well as a community hall for emergency sheltering in case of natural disasters,local events and fund-raising. Our new location will allow easier access to primary roads allowing a faster response to all incidents/ emergencies.</p>					

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Preliminary site engineering and preparation to a point where a contractor can propose an estimate of the planned construction. This will include boundary and topographical survey, forest and wetland delineation, sediment control plan, preliminary landscape and utility layout. Our proposed site consists of 3.7 acres and is zoned DR5.5 and DR16, volunteer fire departments permitted by special exception in these zones. It is located on Hollins Ferry Road, Tax Map 109, and parcel 166. We anticipate construction of a 10,000 to 15,000 square foot facility. The preliminary site engineering and landscape should involve a minimum of twelve workers including professional engineers thru laborers.

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

We have been located at 140 Lavern Avenue in Lansdowne, Md for over 100 years on a 50' x 100' lot. Additions and renovations were made in 1913 and 1953 and in 1973 acquired an adjacent lot to provide parking for our ambulance and two utility vehicles and also parking for our members. We have progressed from the latest in horse drawn fire equipment to currently housing and utilizing two 2007 KME Fire Engines, one 2011 Medic / ALS Ambulance and two utility vehicles. We have ninety?? active members donating their skills, effort and time to serve our community. We have reached a point where our current facility is inadequate for our needs. We are beginning our initial design plans to get to the point where a contractor can produce an accurate estimate of the proposed construction as well as construction plans to obtain required permits to have us shovel ready. We are currently forming an ad hoc fund-raising committee consisting of our attorney and local business men to raise required funds. We anticipate, with your assistance and the efforts of our fund-raising committee and membership to be able to relocate to our new facility within two to three years.
