Our goal is to develop happy, socially well adjusted children by providing a nurturing, educational environment for students of all ages. Our programs focus on toddlers (2 years old), pre-schoolers (3 to 5 years old), and older children (middle school and high school). Our specialty is working with students diagnosed with autism, developmental disabilities, speech/language disorders, and learning disabilities. Some of our children have swallowing issues and behavioral needs as well. Our multi-disciplinary team approach combines special education instruction with speech and language services. We recognize that each child has unique talents, learning styles, and personalities. Our highly-qualified staff is committed to working within each child's comfort zone to ensure optimal social, emotional, and educational results.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The project for the Cisco Center is to connect to the under ground main water supply at the corner of Baltimore Annapolis Blvd. and Simmons Lane in Severna Park, MD. We have a new fire prevention sprinkler system installed and have to change the 1 inch water line coming into the Center to a 4 inch water line to feed the sprinkler system. The trench we need to dig for the new pipe would run from the front of the Center to B & A Blvd. (approximately 25 feet) and then south to Simmons Lane (approximately 110 feet. A new water meter will need to be installed as well as a concrete vault to place it in.
