House Bill 204 Economic Matters (Harford County Delegation)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages Licenses - Residency Requirement for Applicants

This bill alters the residency requirement for applicants of alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford County by requiring each applicant to be a bona fide county resident for at least one year before filing the application.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2012.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. The bill codifies current practice in Harford County.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: An alcoholic beverages license applicant in Harford County must be a bona fide county resident at the time of filing the application and must remain a resident as long as the license is in effect. The applicant is not required to be a registered voter.
