10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)								

The Cecil College Foundation is the development arm of The Milburn Stone Theatre, raising monetary and other types of donations to support the arts. The Friends of the Milburn Stone is an approved subcommittee of the Cecil College Foundation with the mission of developing financial and other resources to support the Milburn Stone Theatre. The "Friends" are committed to ensuring the theatre has the resources necessary to continue to provide outstanding community theatre to the region. In 1992, The Milburn Stone Theatre was built on Cecil Colleges North East Campus to house and continue to produce theatre for the Cecil County community. Over the last twenty years, The Milburn Stone Theatre has been proactive in fostering and supporting excellence, education and appreciation of the arts, while striving at all times to become the

premier theatrical house in the region for our audience, whatever their age or interests.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Milburn Stone Theatre is in dire need of new lights. The current lights are the original instruments that were installed when the theatre opened. These lights are so antiquated that replacement parts are not available. The lenses on the current lights have deteriorated so drastically that they require higher wattage lamps to get the correct amount of brightness on stage. The theatre is using 1000 watts for each instrument as opposed to the 575 watts used by newer, properly working instruments. The degradation of our lighting instruments has resulted in a reduced performing space as our equipment can only appropriately light a smaller area of the stage. Without new lights our stage stage will continue to shrink. Additionally, contractors in the industry no longer know how to use the equipment in the theatre due to changes in technology. The industry standard and what is being taught in all lighting courses is the ETC Source4 lighting instruments. It is a challenge to identify a lighting designer who is willing to work with the current equipment due to its inabilities.

- -The Milburn Stone is proud to host over 7000 patrons and 300 performer participants annually.
- -The Milburn Stone Theatre welcomes Cecil County Public School students to ballet and theatre productions each year. This often provides students with the first opportunity to patronize the performing arts.
- The ETC Source4 lights are used on Broadway and in almost all other theatre districts, which dictates that they will be the industry standard for decades.
- Upgrading to the Source4 instruments increases our energy efficiency by 37%. This decreases our energy usage significantly as well as maintains the quality of the equipment for a longer period of time.
