10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)					
<p>Historic Annapolis (HA) is an IRS 501(c)(3) Maryland non-profit corporation, incorporated June 13, 1952. The purpose of the corporation is (1) To foster the preservation, welfare and advancement of Historic Annapolis and Anne Arundel County, and to encourage the appreciation thereof by the general public. To meet this purpose HA operates nine (9) sites in the Historic District of the City of Annapolis, collects and interprets objects and materials related to the history of Annapolis, provides interpretative programs through, guided tours, dramatic presentations and exhibitions. HA provides research services and consults with property owners, the city's Historic Preservation Commission and testifies, as appropriate, on issues of preservation actions and decisions as appropriate. HA is governed by a volunteer board and employs a full time professional staff of 10, which is augmented by volunteers.</p>					

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Shiplap House (ca. 1715) is one of the oldest woodframe buildings in the City of Annapolis. The property was used as a residence, tavern and tentament until 1957 when it was acquired by Historic Annapolis, Inc. (HA) and restored. In 1980 the property was sold to a private individual and then repurchased by HA in 1987. In 1991 the property was transferred to the state. Concurrently HA and the state signed a long-term lease for operation of the property.

The project will consist of two phases. The initial phase will be the exterior conservation/restoration of the building. This will include repointing all masonry work, repair/reconstructions of exterior windows and doors, selective removal of exterior siding and inspection of sills and other structural elements, repair or replacement of exterior siding, painting of the exterior and replacement of the shake shingle roof. Given the nature of the restoration work, and the actual cost to fully complete phase I, the second phase will only begin once phase I is fully completed. At that time and with a determination that funds are available, then and only then will phase II be undertaken
