10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)				
<p>MCC is non-profit 501(c)3 corporation established on November 11, 1976 under the General Laws of the State of Maryland. It is located at 15200 New Hampshire Avenue, Silver Spring, Maryland 20905. It serves the residents of the State of Maryland in areas of activities involving, but not limited to, religious, educational and cultural. Services are open to all regardless of race, gender, religion, ethnicity or any other discriminatory factor.</p> <p>MCC has operated a comprehensive Medical Center since 2003 for the uninsured and needy residents of the State. Number of patient visit exceeded 8,000 in year 2011.</p> <p>MCC offers regular educational seminars and activities for Diabetes, Cancer, Women's Wellness, Seniors Activities, Adult Literacy and students mentoring. Youth mentoring and counselling programs to keep at-risk youth from joining gangs and becoming radicalized. Tutoring, vocational counselling for youth and adults and after-school help to under performing students.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

MCC Building(s) currently have 22,000 sq. ft of usable space which is currently being used at maximum capacity. Proposed additional construction will add 5,500 sq. ft. of usable space in the form of ADA compliant rest rooms, classrooms, administrative and storage space.

Youth and Adults are being assisted through training, counselling and mentoring to work towards self sufficiency and thereby reduce the pressure on the State and County agencies dealing with unemployment, welfare and unsocial behavior normally attendant on lack of such support system.

Currently MCC's ADA complaint rest rooms are located inside the MCC Clinic. Handicapped visitors have to be wheeled there. When the Clinic is closed then they have to be physically assisted by volunteers to other rest rooms. MCC now routinely has nearly 150 or more handicapped and senior visitors and this process is becoming intolerable.
