## Alcoholic Beverages - Manufacturer's Licenses

This bill authorizes the holder of a specified manufacturer's license (distillery, rectifying, winery, limited winery, or brewery) to hold additional licenses of the same or of a different class for the same or additional premises.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2012.

## Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal increase in State licensing revenue to the extent manufacturers seek to obtain additional licenses. Manufacturer's license fees range from $\$ 200$ to $\$ 2,000$, depending on class. State expenditures are not affected.

Local Effect: None.
Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful. Manufacturer's licensees may realize an economic benefit from being able to hold additional licenses.

## Analysis

Current Law: Except for a Class 6 pub-brewery license, the holder of a distillery, rectifying, winery, limited winery, or brewery license may apply for and obtain, under a different name, one or more additional distillery, rectifying, winery, limited winery, or brewery licenses for the same or another premises. The licenses may be issued to different persons or under trade names used by persons occupying a part of or all of the same premises. The holder of a rectifying, winery, or brewery license may apply for and obtain a wholesaler's license of any class for the same premises or elsewhere. The holder of a limited winery license may apply for and obtain a Class 6 limited wine wholesaler's license for the same premises or elsewhere.

State Fiscal Effect: General fund revenues may increase by a minimal amount beginning in fiscal 2013 to the extent alcoholic beverage manufacturer's licensees obtain additional manufacturer's licenses. The amount of any increase will depend on the number of licensees obtaining additional licenses and the type and amount of each license fee. The number of times this may occur cannot be reliably estimated. Exhibit 1 shows the number of manufacturer's licenses and corresponding fee revenue for fiscal 2011.
