10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)								
The mission statement of Friends Aware, Inc. states: Building on a tradition of excellence, Friends Aware offers social, occupational, and residential opportunities in a caring atmosphere to individuals with disabilities. Our vision statement focuses on the overall purpose of Friends Aware: to be an agency where all individuals are challenged to realize their full potential. Friends Aware, Inc. is a non-profit organization founded in 1954 to provide services to individuals with intellectual/ developmental disabilities living in Allegany County. Services to individuals include Day Habilitation, Vocational, Supported Employment, Respite, Transportation, and Residential and Supports services. These programs exist in order to assist individuals to acquire the skills								

necessary to live and work as independently as possible in the community.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Friends Aware, Inc seeks to upgrade its current facility. The main, and overriding, goal is to bring the facility up to full compliance with ADA requirements, including bathrooms, hallways, and entrances. The building does not currently have a sprinkler system. Many of our individuals require extra time to enter or exit our buses, often due the fact they are wheelchair bound, and are subject to the weather as they access their transportation. Therefore, they are in need of a covered entry into the building from our buses. The current traffic flow and pattern presents a safety issue for our transportation and contract work programs. In addition, building access for emergency services personnel is compromised. Due to lack of available office space, a portion of the administrative staff are housed in an off-site rental space. Handicapped accessible parking is extremely limited. The growth of the square footage of the agency is a reflection of the need for larger hallways, handicap-accessible bathrooms, and office space to accommodate off-site administrative team members.

Building on a tradition of excellence, Friends Aware offers social, occupational, and residential opportunities in a caring atmosphere to individuals with disabilities. The mission statement of Friends Aware reminds us of the long history of Friends Aware in our community. Begun in 1954 by a small group of committed parents and interested individuals, Friends Aware has grown to a full, part time, and substitute staff of 245 and a budget of 6.1 million. The Friends Aware Life Enrichment Center, located at 1601 Holland St., provides Day Habilitation and Vocational services to over 120 individuals Monday through Friday. Within the Day program, individuals have the opportunity to develop social and vocational skills in an effort to achieve greater independence. Our vocational program offers individuals with opportunities to earn a paycheck through contract work. We currently maintain contracts with 20 vendors throughout the region. Many of our individuals aspire to independent employment and Friends Aware works to assist them in their goal. Currently, we have over 40 individuals employed in the community at over 25 different businesses. In operation since 1977, the Residential program at Friends Aware currently maintains 13 different homes for individuals as well as offering support to individuals who maintain their own residence. Currently, 65 individuals utilize this service in locations throughout Allegany County. Included in this program is 24-hour on-call nursing services. Access to transportation is an issue for many individuals in Allegany County, including the people who utilize our services. Friends Aware provides door-to-door transportation for 96 individuals living independently or with family each program day. In addition, the Residential program provides for all the transportation needs of those individuals utilizing this program. In addition, Friends Aware has contracted services to Allegany County Board of Education Transition Youth Program for the past 5 years. 5 students are presently enrolled in this program located in the Life Enrichment Center. Friends Aware works to develop partnerships and collaborative relationships within the community as part of its service delivery. Among the agencies and programs Friends Aware maintains relationships with are: Allegany County Board of Education, Allegany College of Maryland, Service Coordination, Maryland Cooperative Extension, City of Cumberland, Allegany Transit Authority, County United Way, Bishop Walsh School, Western Maryland Food Bank, Special Olympics, League of Crippled Children, Alhambra Shrine Tranportation Unit, and Pharmacare.
