BACKGROUND - Academy of Success, Inc. is a community-based non-profit tax exempt 501C3 organization located in Baltimore City. AOS was established in 1999 as an after-school youth services provider to address the needs of vulnerable and under-served populations in Baltimore City. The organization started its service delivery by providing quality supplemental education services, life skills, mentoring and other enrichment services at Calverton Middle School. In the fall of 2000 the organization expanded it services and capacity with the opening of the Academy of Success Youth Development Center. AOS developed and implemented a holistic approach for delivering an array of direct services to children, youth and families to increase educational outcomes, develop critical life skills, resolve conflicts and build caring & supportive relationships for children and youth as a strategy for preventing and/or reducing substance abuse, crime, violence and school dropout rates. MISSION - AOS mission is to improve the quality of life for children, youth and families in Baltimore City.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

In 2007 AOS launched an effort to create a central point of access to a comprehensive menu of services that are aligned with the immediate needs of children, youth & families Southwest Baltimore communities with an aim to increase the rate of self-sufficiency among residents. AOS has acquired and currently renovating the campus of the former Lasting Paints Company in the Shipley Hills neighborhood of Baltimore to serve as home to the Academy of Success Community Empowerment Center (AOS-CEC). Through the collaborative efforts of a committed community partnership a shared-vision to ensure the health, safety, education and overall empowerment of Baltimore City residents have begun. The VISION of AOS is that vulnerable and under-served populations in Baltimore City will be empowered as each individual develops the potential and receives the resources needed for managing their own life; each family recognizes their right and except the responsibility to participate in the affairs of their community and each organization or community that we serve will create and social climate which encourages individual growth and positive development.

AOS-CEC integration of services and opportunities will provide family-strengthening, early childhood learning, comprehensive after-school programming, demand-driven vocational training, urban farming, small business incubation and a variety of health services. With employment as a significant focus for economic stability and self-sufficiency, southwest residences will gain job skills that provide transition into apprenticeships and end with employment in general construction, solar panel installation, hospitality and technology. The goal is to achieve economic stability through workforce skill building, self-sustaining and growth-oriented businesses, cooperatives and other mercantile endeavors that ensure good jobs, upward mobility and wealth accumulation. AOS-CEC is being built for the community, by the community. AOS-CEC is not intended to be just another program. Instead it is the shared vision of a people (community members, stakeholders and policy makers) who embrace the concept of building for the people, by the people. A shared vision is more than an idea. It is a force of impressive power within the hearts of people who are bound together by a common aspiration (Senge). AOS-CEC is also about a place that serves as a community hub/one-stop center that is rich with opportunity, supportive services and essential resources developed with community input that meets their needs. It is also about a process for creating an environment that supports the healthy development, safety and security of individuals and families of an entire community. Over the past ten years the AOS has served over 4000 clients through high quality programs and services that include supplemental and general educational services, workforce development, job readiness training, youth development, crime prevention, and family strengthening services. AOS outcomes and achievements include, but are not limited to: Created Two Community School Programs providing over twenty additional community partners at each school which increased support services to students, their family members & school staff. Increased Structured After-School Programs servicing an average of 150 youth per year with an 80% retention and 85% average daily attendance rate Coordinated & Managed over 30,000 hours of Volunteer Community Service that has helped to reduce crime & grime, increased educational outcomes, positive youth development, strengthened families, created community park space, emergency support services and much more.
