## 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Montgomery Parks Foundation is a registered 501(c)(3) with the State of Maryland and the organization recognized as the fund-raising and support organization through a Memorandum of Understanding(MOU) for the Maryland-National Capital Park&Planning Commission (M-NCPPC)/Montgomery Parks. The Montgomery Parks Foundation is governed by an independent Board of Trustees approved by the Montgomery County Planning Board. The Montgomery County Department of Parks (Montgomery Parks) is a key agency of M-NCPPC, the proud steward of over 35,000 acres of parkland. The mission of Montgomery Parks is to protect and interpret the country's valuable natural and cultural resources, balance the demand for recreation with the need for conservation; offer a variety of enjoyable recreational activities that encourage healthy lifestyles; and provide clean, safe and accessible places for leisure time activities.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

This funding will further the existing project of converting the Woodlawn Barn for public use. Working within the existing requirements of the historic easement, The Woodlawn Visitors Center Project will repair and rehabilitate a magnificent 1832 three story stone arched bank barn and surrounding landscape and develop, produce and install an interpretive program. The program will tell stories of the Underground Railroad and Quaker Heritage in Montgomery County and the barn as an important feature of the agricultural landscape. It will also interpret the Quaker family who built Woodlawn Manor and the adjacent Underground Railroad Experience Trail. The main attraction will be multi-media exhibits throughout the barn. Images, sounds, and stories will be projected across interior walls and spaces to create a unique experience for visitors without harming the historic fabric of the structure.

## 28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

- This project is shovel ready for Spring 2013 construction
- The project will employ architects, engineers, construction managers, trades and many others-
- Upon project completion the Woodlawn Barn Visitor's Center will increase heritage tourism to the Sandy Spring area and provide increased tourist dollars to the neighborhood economy
- The barn is eligible for listing on the prestigious National Park Service's National Register of Historic Places
- The stone barn and its historic landscape bounded by Norwood and Ednor Roads are within an easement boundary held and regulated by the Maryland Historical Trust
- The Visitor Center is located at the southern tip of the Sandy Spring/Ashton Master Plan area near many other historic master plan sites
- The project culminated in the 2002 Montgomery County Heritage Area Management Plan, under an eastern county theme called the Quaker and Underground Railroad Cluster, and conceived as a gateway to historic Sandy Spring
- The Planning Board approved the project in 2003. Since then, the project budget has not been adjusted for inflation or additional work required to comply with historic regulatory reviews and approvals of the project.

Note 1: Montgomery County owns the property, the M-NCPPC manages, maintains and steward the property for public use, and does not lease the property from the county. The County and the Commission have a MOU that applies to all parkland titled with the county.
