16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
18	Article – Courts and Judicial Proceedings
19	SUBTITLE 19. LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY DOG BITE.
20	3–1901.
21	IN A CIVIL ACTION FOR DAMAGES CAUSED BY A DOG BITE, THE COMMON
22	LAW THAT APPLIED ON JANUARY 1, 2012, TO A CIVIL ACTION FOR DAMAGES
23	CAUSED BY A DOG BITE SHALL BE RETAINED.



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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 3 of this Act, it is the intent of the General Assembly that this Act abrogate the holding of the Court of Appeals in Tracey v. Solesky, No. 53, September Term 2011.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect on or application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through September 30, 2013, and, at the end of September 30, 2013, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
