$15\\16$	(a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) OR (C) of this section or in other law, the effective date of a regulation is:
17 18	(i) the 10th calendar day after notice of adoption is published in the Register; or
19	(ii) a later date that the notice sets.
20	(2) For calculation of the effective date under this subsection:
21	(i) Article 1, § 36 of the Code does not apply;

1 (ii) the issue date of the Register in which the notice is 2 published is not counted; and

5 (b) The effective date of a regulation after its emergency adoption is the date 6 that the Committee sets.

7 (C) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW, A 8 REGULATION THAT INCREASES A FEE OR FINE THAT A UNIT IS AUTHORIZED TO 9 IMPOSE MAY NOT TAKE EFFECT UNTIL THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY APPROVES 10 THE INCREASE THROUGH LEGISLATION ENACTED INTO LAW.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 12 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, 13 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 14 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 15 the date it is enacted.
