A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Procurement – Use of State Residents and Businesses

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a State procurement unit to adopt regulations 4 concerning the use of State residents and businesses for certain procurement $\mathbf{5}$ contracts; specifying that the regulations require a unit to make a certain 6 determination before awarding each procurement concerning resident bidders 7 or resident offerors; requiring that the regulations encourage a nonresident 8 bidder or nonresident offeror that is awarded a procurement contract to employ 9 State residents and use State businesses in the performance of the procurement 10 contract; and generally relating to regulations concerning the use of State 11 residents and businesses for procurement contracts.
