1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Utility Service Protection Program – Annual Report – Deadline**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the date by which the Public Service Commission must
4 report each year to the General Assembly on terminations of gas or electric
5 service occurring during the previous heating season; and generally relating to
6 the Utility Service Protection Program.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 **Article – Public Utilities**

20 7–307.

1 (a) In this section, “termination of service” means the termination, reduction,
2 or refusal to reinstate gas or electric service, or any other action that has the effect of
3 reducing or denying gas or electric service because of nonpayment.

4 (c) (1) In accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on or
5 before ~~[June 1]~~ **SEPTEMBER 1** of each year, the Commission shall report to the
6 General Assembly on terminations of service by public service companies during the
7 previous heating season.

8 (2) The report shall include information in sufficient detail to indicate
9 the effect of the terminations of service on various categories of customers, including:

10 (i) income levels;

11 (ii) geographic areas;

12 (iii) energy assistance recipients; and

13 (iv) any other category that the Commission determines is
14 relevant to evaluate how the State may best address the problem of assuring adequate
15 gas and electric service for low income residential customers.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 June 1, 2013.
