# Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2013, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of <u>2005</u>, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, and 2012

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of <del>One</del>  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Billion, One Hundred Three Million, Six Thousand Dollars (\$1,103,006,000) One 7 Billion, One Hundred Eight Million, One Hundred and Eighty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$1,108,184,000) One Billion. One Hundred Million. Seven Hundred and 8 Twenty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,727,000) One Billion, One Hundred 9 and Nine Million, One Hundred and Nineteen Thousand Dollars 10 (\$1,109,119,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, 11 12construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real estate in 13 14connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other 15organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to
