1 AN ACT concerning

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Owner or Operator of Livery Stable - Lien on Dairy Animal

FOR the purpose of granting an owner or operator of a livery stable or other establishment who gives care or custody to a dairy animal a lien on the dairy animal for a certain charge incurred for the milking of the dairy animal for the milk to be provided to a certain person; and generally relating to the granting of a lien to owners or operators of livery stables or other establishments for a charge incurred for milking a dairy animal.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (a) The owner or operator of a livery stable or other establishment who gives 19 care or custody to any livestock has a lien on the livestock for any reasonable charge
- 20 incurred for:
- 21 (1) Board and custody;
- 22 (2) Training;

2 3 4	(4) MILKING A DAIRY ANIMAL FOR THE UNPASTEURIZED MILK TO BE PROVIDED TO AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A PARTIAL OR COMPLETE OWNERSHIP INTEREST IN THE DAIRY ANIMAL; AND
5	[(4)] (5) Other proper maintenance expenses.
6 7 8	(b) If the charges which give rise to the lien are due and unpaid for 30 days and the lienor is in possession of the livestock, the lienor may sell the livestock to which the lien attaches at public sale.
9 10 11	(c) (1) The lienor shall publish notice of the sale once a week for two successive weeks in one or more newspapers of general circulation in the county where the livestock is located.
12 13 14 15 16	(2) In addition, the lienor shall send notice by registered or certified mail at least 30 days before the sale to the owner of the livestock at his last known address. If the owner's address is unknown, the notice may be given by posting it on the door of the courthouse or on a bulletin board in the immediate vicinity of the door of the courthouse of the county where the livestock is located.
17	(d) (1) The proceeds of the sale shall be applied, in the following order, to:
18	(i) The expenses of the sale; and
19	(ii) The amount of the lien claim.
20 21	(2) After application of the proceeds in accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection, any remaining balance shall be paid to the owner of the livestock.
22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
