2 **Health Occupations – State Board of Social Work Examiners – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of renaming a certain license issued by the State Board of Social
4 Work Examiners; requiring the appointment of a certain licensee to the Board
5 within a certain number of months of a certain vacancy on the Board; altering
6 the number of signatures required for a certain list of nominees; authorizing
7 certain officers or directors to submit a certain list of nominees; exempting a
8 certain member of the Board from a certain requirement; requiring the Board to
9 elect certain officers for certain purposes; requiring the Board to determine the
10 manner of election of certain officers and the duties of certain officers;
11 exempting certain students from certain licensure requirements; requiring
12 certain applicants to complete a certain criminal history records check and
13 submit to a certain examination under certain circumstances; authorizing
14 certain applicants to meet certain licensure requirements by receiving a certain

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article – Health Occupations**

23 19–101.

24 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

25 (b) “Board” means the State Board of Social Work Examiners.

26 (d) “License” means, unless the context requires otherwise, one of four types
27 of licenses issued by the Board authorizing an individual to practice:

28 (1) [Associate] **BACHELOR** social work;

29 (2) Graduate social work;

30 (3) Certified social work; or

31 (4) Certified social work–clinical.

1 (e) “Licensed [associate] **BACHELOR** social worker” means an individual
2 licensed by the Board to practice [associate] **BACHELOR** social work.

3 (i) “Practice [associate] **BACHELOR** social work” means to practice social
4 work:

5 (1) Under the supervision of a licensed certified social worker, licensed
6 certified social worker–clinical, or licensed graduate social worker who meets the
7 conditions specified in regulations; and

8 (2) Utilizing the education and training required under § 19–302(b) of
9 this title.

10 (j) “Practice certified social work” means to practice social work utilizing the
11 education, training, and experience required under § 19–302(d) [or (e)] of this title.

12 (m) (1) “Practice social work” means to apply the theories, knowledge,
13 procedures, methods, or ethics derived from a formal educational program in social
14 work to restore or enhance social functioning of individuals, couples, families, groups,
15 organizations, or communities through:

16 (i) Assessment;

17 [(ii) Formulating diagnostic impressions;]

18 [(iii) **(II)** Planning;

19 [(iv) **(III)** Intervention;

20 [(v) **(IV)** Evaluation of intervention plans;

21 [(vi) **(V)** Case management;

22 [(vii) **(VI)** Information and referral;

23 [(viii) **(VII)** Counseling that does not include diagnosis or
24 treatment of mental disorders;

25 [(ix) **(VIII)** Advocacy;

26 [(x) **(IX)** Consultation;

27 [(xi) **(X)** Education;

28 [(xii) **(XI)** Research;

1 [(xiii)] **(XII)** Community organization; or

2 [(xiv)] **(XIII)** Development, implementation, and administration of
3 policies, programs, and activities.

4 (2) For an individual licensed as a graduate social worker, “practice
5 social work” also includes:

6 (i) Supervision of other social workers if the graduate social
7 worker meets the requirements set out in regulations; [and]

8 **(II) FORMULATING A DIAGNOSIS, UNDER THE DIRECT**
9 **SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL;**

10 [(ii)] **(III)** Treatment of [psychosocial conditions]
11 **BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS;** and

12 **(IV) TREATMENT OF** mental disorders and the provision of
13 psychotherapy under the direct supervision of a licensed certified social
14 worker–clinical.

15 (3) For an individual licensed as a certified social worker, “practice
16 social work” also includes:

17 (i) Supervision of other social workers; [and]

18 **(II) FORMULATING A DIAGNOSIS, UNDER THE DIRECT**
19 **SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED CERTIFIED SOCIAL WORKER–CLINICAL;**

20 [(ii)] **(III)** Treatment of [psychosocial conditions]
21 **BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL CONDITIONS;** and

22 **(IV) TREATMENT OF** mental disorders and the provision of
23 psychotherapy under the direct supervision of a licensed certified social
24 worker–clinical.

25 (4) For an individual licensed as a certified social worker–clinical,
26 “practice social work” also includes:

27 (i) Supervision of other social workers;

28 (ii) Evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment of [psychosocial]
29 **BIOPSYCHOSOCIAL** conditions, mental and emotional conditions and impairments,
30 and mental disorders as defined in § 10–101(f) of the Health – General Article; [and]

1 **(III) PETITIONING FOR EMERGENCY EVALUATION UNDER**
 2 **TITLE 10, SUBTITLE 6 OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE; AND**

3 ~~[(iii)]~~ **(IV)** The provision of psychotherapy.

4 (n) “Psychotherapy” means [a method for] the **ASSESSMENT AND** treatment
 5 of mental disorders and behavioral disturbances [in which a licensed health care
 6 practitioner enters into a professional contract with the patient and, through a
 7 therapeutic communication or interaction, attempts to:

8 (1) Alleviate emotional disturbances;

9 (2) Reverse or alter maladaptive patterns of behavior; or

10 (3) Encourage personality growth and development].

12 (a) (3) If a licensed [social work associate] **BACHELOR SOCIAL WORKER,**
 13 a licensed graduate social worker, a licensed certified social worker, a licensed
 14 certified social worker–clinical, or a licensed social worker is not appointed to the
 15 Board under paragraph (2)(i) of this subsection within [6] **3** months of a vacancy, a
 16 licensee of any license level shall be appointed immediately if that licensee is qualified
 17 to be a member of the Board under subsections (b) and (d) of this section.

18 (5) The Governor shall appoint all social work members of the Board
 19 from a list of nominees containing names submitted by:

20 (i) Professional social work associations in the State;

21 (ii) Any person who provides a statement of nomination signed
 22 by at least [25] **15** social workers licensed in the State; [or]

23 (iii) The secretaries of public agencies of the State where social
 24 workers are employed; **OR**

25 **(IV) THE CORPORATE EXECUTIVE OFFICERS OR EXECUTIVE**
 26 **DIRECTORS OF PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS WHERE SOCIAL WORKERS ARE**
 27 **EMPLOYED.**

28 (d) Except for the licensed **BACHELOR** social worker [associate] member and
 29 the licensed graduate social worker member, each social worker member of the Board
 30 shall have been licensed in the State for 5 years immediately preceding the
 31 appointment and actively employed in the field of social work for at least 3 of the 5
 32 years immediately preceding the appointment.

2 (a) (1) From among its members, the Board shall elect a [chairman]
3 **CHAIR, VICE CHAIR,** and [a secretary] **SECRETARY–TREASURER** every 2 years.

4 (2) The Board may elect other officers as necessary to fulfill the duties
5 and responsibilities of the Board.

6 (b) The Board shall determine:

7 (1) The manner of election of the [chairman, secretary,] **CHAIR,**
8 **VICE CHAIR, SECRETARY–TREASURER,** and other officers; and

12 (1) Licensed by the Board before the individual may practice social
13 work in this State while representing oneself as a social worker; or

14 (2) Licensed as a certified social worker–clinical before the individual

16 (b) This section does not apply to:

17 (1) An individual employed by any agency of the federal government
18 while performing the duties of that employment;

19 (2) An individual licensed as a social worker in another state while
20 responding to an emergency in this State; [or]

21 (3) An individual who:

22 (i) Is licensed to practice social work in any other state;

23 (ii) Has an application for a license pending before the Board;

24 and

25 (iii) Meets requirements established by the Board in regulations;

1 **(4) A STUDENT WHILE PURSUING A SUPERVISED COURSE OF**
2 **STUDY IN A SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM THAT IS ACCREDITED OR IS A CANDIDATE**

5 subsection (b)(3) of this section for more than 6 months.

7 (a) To obtain a license, an applicant shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of
8 the Board that the applicant:

9 (1) Has submitted a complete written application in the form
10 prescribed by the Board;

11 (2) Is at least 18 years old;

12 (3) Is of good moral character;

13 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this title, has successfully passed
14 an examination or examinations prescribed by the Board pertinent to the license
15 sought; [and]

16 (5) Has paid all applicable fees specified by the Board [relative to the
17 licensure process];

18 **(6) HAS COMPLETED A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK IN**
19 **ACCORDANCE WITH § 19-302.2 OF THIS SUBTITLE AT THE APPLICANT'S**
20 **EXPENSE; AND**

21 **(7) HAS SUBMITTED TO AN EXAMINATION IF REQUIRED UNDER §**
22 **19-302.3 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

23 (b) To obtain a **BACHELOR** social work [associate] license, an applicant
24 shall:

25 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section; and

26 (2) Have received a baccalaureate degree in social work from a
27 program **THAT IS** accredited **OR IS A CANDIDATE FOR ACCREDITATION** by the
28 Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the
29 Council on Social Work Education.

30 (c) **[(1)]** To obtain a graduate social worker license, an applicant shall:

1 [(i)] (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this
2 section; and

3 [(ii)] (2) Have received a master's degree from a program
4 **THAT IS** accredited **OR IS A CANDIDATE FOR ACCREDITATION** by the Council on
5 Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the Council on
6 Social Work Education.

7 [(2) (i) To obtain a provisional graduate social worker license, an
8 applicant shall:

9 1. Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this
10 section; and

11 2. Have received a master's degree from a program
12 which had received formal candidacy status from the Council on Social Work
13 Education or an equivalent organization approved by the Council on Social Work
14 Education at the time the degree was awarded.

15 (ii) A provisional graduate social work license shall be issued for
16 the lesser of a period:

17 1. Not to exceed 3 years; or

18 2. Until the program has attained accredited status from
19 the Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the
20 Council on Social Work Education.

21 (iii) Provisional licensees whose degree programs become
22 accredited during the license period shall be permitted to apply for a license as a
23 graduate social worker upon accreditation being granted to the program.]

24 (d) Except as provided in § 19–302.1 of this subtitle, to obtain a certified
25 social worker license, an applicant shall:

26 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section;

27 (2) Have received a master's degree from a program accredited by the
28 Council on Social Work Education or an equivalent organization approved by the
29 Council on Social Work Education; and

30 (3) Except as provided in subsection (g) of this section, provide in a
31 form prescribed by the Board, documentation of having completed 2 years as a licensee
32 with supervised experience of at least 3,000 hours after receiving the master's degree
33 with a minimum of [144] **100** hours of periodic face-to-face supervision in the practice

1 of social work under the terms and conditions that the Board determines by
2 regulation.

3 (e) Except as provided in § 19–302.1 of this subtitle, to obtain a certified
4 social worker–clinical license, an applicant shall:

5 (1) Meet the requirements of subsection (a) of this section;

6 (2) Have received a master’s degree in social work and documentation
7 of **COMPLETION OF 12 ACADEMIC CREDITS IN** clinical course work from a
8 ~~MASTER’S DEGREE~~ program accredited by the Council on Social Work Education or
9 an equivalent organization approved by the Council on Social Work Education, **WITH**
10 **A MINIMUM OF 6 OF THE 12 ACADEMIC CREDITS OBTAINED IN A MASTER’S**
11 **DEGREE PROGRAM**; and

12 (3) Provide in a form prescribed by the Board, documentation of
13 having completed 2 years as a licensee with supervised experience of at least 3,000
14 hours, **OF WHICH 1,500 HOURS ARE IN FACE-TO-FACE CLIENT CONTACT**, after
15 receiving the master’s degree with a minimum of 144 hours of periodic face-to-face
16 supervision in the assessment, formulation of a diagnostic impression, and treatment
17 of mental disorders and other conditions and the provision of psychotherapy under the
18 terms and conditions that the Board determines by regulation.

19 [(f) If the supervision required for a certified social worker license under
20 subsection (d)(3) of this section was not available to the applicant while the applicant
21 was obtaining the required 2 years of experience, the Board may waive the supervision
22 requirement on the request of the applicant.

23 (g) If an applicant who is licensed or registered to practice social work in
24 another state has obtained 2 years of supervised experience under circumstances that
25 are otherwise equivalent to those required under subsection (d) of this section, the
26 Board may waive the supervision requirement.]

28 (A) **IN THIS SECTION, “CENTRAL REPOSITORY” MEANS THE CRIMINAL**

6 (3) THE PROCESSING FEE REQUIRED BY THE FEDERAL BUREAU

8 (C) IN ACCORDANCE WITH §§ 10-201 THROUGH 10-228 OF THE
9 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE, THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL FORWARD
10 TO THE BOARD AND TO THE APPLICANT THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD
11 INFORMATION OF THE APPLICANT.

12 (D) IF AN APPLICANT HAS MADE TWO OR MORE UNSUCCESSFUL
13 ATTEMPTS AT SECURING LEGIBLE FINGERPRINTS, THE BOARD MAY ACCEPT AN
14 ALTERNATE METHOD OF CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK AS PERMITTED
15 BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTRAL REPOSITORY AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE
16 FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.

8 **(A) THE BOARD MAY REQUIRE AN APPLICANT TO SUBMIT TO A MENTAL**
9 **OR PHYSICAL EXAMINATION BY A HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER DESIGNATED BY**
10 **THE BOARD IF THE BOARD:**

11 **(1) HAS REASON TO BELIEVE THAT THE APPLICANT MAY CAUSE**
12 **HARM TO THE APPLICANT OR TO ANOTHER PERSON;**

13 **(2) MAKES A WRITTEN REQUEST FOR THE APPLICANT TO SUBMIT**
14 **TO THE EXAMINATION;**

28 **THE CONTROL OF THE APPLICANT.**

1 (a) An approved applicant is entitled to be examined for licensure as
2 provided in this section.

3 (b) The Board shall ensure that a Board–approved examination for each
4 category of license is made available for an applicant to take at least twice a year, at
5 the times and places that the Board determines.

6 (c) The Board shall notify each approved applicant of the procedures for
7 taking the examination.

8 (d) (1) The Board shall approve the subjects, scope, form, and passing
9 score for each type of examination given under this subtitle.

10 (2) The examinations given under this subtitle shall strive to be free of
11 cultural bias.

12 (e) (1) The Board, by regulation, may limit:

13 (i) The number of times an applicant may be reexamined after
14 failing an examination required under this subtitle; and

15 (ii) The interval between reexaminations.

16 (2) If an applicant is permitted to be reexamined under paragraph (1)
17 of this subsection, the applicant shall pay a fee to the examining body approved by the
18 Board.

19 [(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 19–302 of this subtitle, an applicant
20 for a certified social worker license or a certified social worker–clinical license who was
21 enrolled in a doctoral program on October 1, 1992 and has remained continuously
22 enrolled in a doctoral program and who otherwise qualifies for the applicable license is
23 entitled to be examined for that license as provided in this section.]

24 [(g) (F) The examination shall be prepared to measure the competence of
25 the applicant to engage in the pertinent practice of social work.

7 is pending to have the conviction or plea set aside;

8 **[(9)] (8)** Provides professional services while:

9 (i) Under the influence of alcohol; or

10 (ii) Using any narcotic or controlled dangerous substance, as
11 defined in § 5–101 of the Criminal Law Article, or other drug that is in excess of
12 prescribed amounts or without valid medical indication;

13 **[(10)] (9)** Is disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority of any
14 state, country, or branch of the armed services, or the Veterans' Administration for an
