A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Alternatives to the General Educational Development Tests – Study

FOR the purpose of requiring the Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning in the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to conduct a certain study regarding the evaluation of alternative methods for obtaining the equivalent of a high school diploma; requiring the Division to submit the results of the study to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a study regarding the evaluation of alternative methods for obtaining the equivalent of a high school diploma.

- 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That:
- 12 (a) The Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning in the 13 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation shall conduct a study to identify 14 alternative methods for an individual to earn the equivalent of a high school diploma 15 without passing the General Educational Development tests.
- 16 (b) When conducting the study required under subsection (a) of this section, 17 the Division shall consider whether:
- 18 (1) an alternative method presents greater opportunities for 19 individuals to obtain the equivalent of a high school diploma;
- 20 (2) an alternative method adequately measures the major subject area knowledge and skills considered to be the outcomes of a high school education;
- 22 (3) the costs of an alternative method as compared with the costs of 23 the General Educational Development tests justify the adoption of an alternative 24 method;
