2 **Howard County – Alcoholic Beverages Establishments – Distance from**
3 **Schools**

4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain minimum distance restriction in Howard County
5 so as to prohibit the issuance of a Class B alcoholic beverages license for a
6 restaurant located a certain distance from a public school building; making a
7 stylistic change; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Howard
8 County.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

2 (a) This section applies only in Howard County.

3 (b) (1) **(I) [A] SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBPARAGRAPH**
4 **(II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH,** A license to sell alcoholic beverages may not be first issued
5 after June 30, 1971, for any building located within 500 feet of the nearest point of
6 [the] A public school building.

7 **(II) A CLASS B LICENSE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**
8 **MAY NOT BE ISSUED FOR A RESTAURANT LOCATED WITHIN 400 FEET FROM THE**
9 **NEAREST POINT OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL BUILDING.**

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 July 1, 2013.
