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- 1 AN ACT concerning
- 2 Natural Resources Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup
- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup; 4 providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but 5 6 authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to 7 define challenges to, explore opportunities for improving, and make recommendations regarding the preservation of plant species native to the State 8 9 requiring the Workgroup to report its findings region: recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 10 11 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup. 12
- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That:
- 15 (a) There is a Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup.
- 16 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 18 of the Senate:
