A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Natural Resources - Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Workgroup; prohibiting 4 a member of the Workgroup from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Workgroup to define challenges to, explore opportunities for improving, and make recommendations regarding the preservation of plant species native to the State 9 region: requiring the Workgroup to report its findings recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to 12the Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That: 14
 - (a) There is a Maryland Botanical Heritage Workgroup.
