- (2) make recommendations on the development of a combined care management model to address both care and coordination of physical and mental health, substance abuse care, and other nonmedical delinquency risk factors for at—risk juveniles in State and local government programs, including anticipated costs and potential sources of funding for the model; and
- (3) make recommendations on the development of a screening tool designated and tested for use with juveniles located in multiple State and local systems, including anticipated costs and potential sources of funding for the screening tool.
- (b) The Children's Cabinet shall report its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on or before December 1, 2013.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 2014, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
