BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 16-305(e) and 16-508 Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 16 - 305.
