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## Procurements by Maryland Department of Transportation – Accidental Death and Dismemberment Benefits Required

FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Maryland Department of Transportation from 4 5 deeming a bidder or offeror as prequalified if the Department determines that 6 the bidder or offeror fails to provide accidental death and dismemberment 7 benefits for its employees; providing that a prospective bidder or offeror that is 8 not prequalified that makes a bid or offer on a procurement by the Department 9 may not be deemed a responsible bidder or offeror unless the bidder or offeror submits evidence satisfactory to the Department that the bidder or offeror 10 provides accidental death and dismemberment benefits for its employees; and 11 12 generally relating to a requirement that bidders and offerors in procurements by the Maryland Department of Transportation provide accidental death and 13 dismemberment benefits for their employees. 14
