CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Legal Services Corporation Funding – Abandoned Property Funds**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the distributee of certain abandoned property funds that
4 the Comptroller is required to distribute each year; altering the amount that the
5 Comptroller is required to distribute; repealing certain provisions of law
6 requiring the Governor to appropriate a certain amount in certain budgets each
7 year to the Maryland Legal Services Corporation Fund; repealing certain
8 provisions of law authorizing the Governor to transfer a certain amount to the
9 Fund from a certain portion of abandoned property funds; altering a certain
10 source of money in the Fund; and generally relating to Maryland Legal Services
11 Corporation funding.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Commercial Law**

4 17–317.

5 (a) (1) All funds received under this title, including the proceeds of the
6 sale of abandoned property under § 17–316 of this subtitle, shall be credited by the
7 Administrator to a special fund. The Administrator shall retain in the special fund at
8 the end of each fiscal year, from the proceeds received, an amount not to exceed
9 \$50,000, from which sum the Administrator shall pay any claim allowed under this
10 title.

11 (2) After deducting all costs incurred in administering this title from
12 the remaining net funds the Administrator shall distribute [~~\$500,000~~] **\$3,000,000** to
13 the Maryland Legal Services Corporation [to support the activities of the corporation]
14 **FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER § 11–402 OF THE HUMAN SERVICES ARTICLE.**

15 (3) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the
16 Administrator shall distribute all unclaimed money from judgments of restitution
17 under Title 11, Subtitle 6 of the Criminal Procedure Article to the State Victims of
18 Crime Fund established under § 11–916 of the Criminal Procedure Article to assist
19 victims of crimes and delinquent acts to protect the victims' rights as provided by law.

20 (ii) If a victim entitled to restitution that has been treated as
21 abandoned property under § 11–614 of the Criminal Procedure Article is located after
22 the money has been distributed under this paragraph, the Administrator shall reduce
23 the next distribution to the State Victims of Crime Fund by the amount recovered by
24 the victim.

25 (4) After making the distributions required under paragraphs (2) and
26 (3) of this subsection, the Administrator shall distribute the remaining net funds not
27 retained under paragraph (1) of this subsection to the General Fund of the State.

28 **Article – Human Services**

29 11–401.

30 [(a) In the State operating budget or in any supplemental budget that the
31 Governor submits to the General Assembly, the Governor shall appropriate at least
32 \$500,000 each year to the Maryland Legal Services Corporation Fund established
33 under § 11–402 of this subtitle.

34 (b) (1) To support or add to the appropriation under subsection (a) of this
35 section, on July 1 of each year, the Governor may transfer to the Fund up to \$500,000

1 from the portion of abandoned property funds deposited in the General Fund of the
2 State under § 17–317 of the Commercial Law Article.

3 (2) If, after deducting all costs of administering the abandoned
4 property fund, the balance in the portion of abandoned property funds deposited in the
5 General Fund of the State under § 17–317 of the Commercial Law Article is less than
6 \$500,000, only the balance may be transferred in accordance with paragraph (1) of this
7 subsection.

8 (c) Nonstate funds received by the Corporation shall be accounted for and
9 reported as receipts and disbursements separate and distinct from State funds.

11 (a) There is a Maryland Legal Services Corporation Fund.

12 (b) The Administrative Office of the Courts shall administer the Fund.

13 (c) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of
14 the State Finance and Procurement Article.

15 (d) The Fund consists of:

16 (1) money deposited to the Fund from the surcharge assessed in civil
17 cases under §§ 7–202 and 7–301 of the Courts Article;

18 (2) [money appropriated to the Fund under § 11–401 of this subtitle]
19 **MONEY DISTRIBUTED TO THE FUND UNDER § 17–317 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW**
20 **ARTICLE;**

21 (3) interest on attorney trust accounts paid to the Fund under §
22 10–303 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; and

23 (4) investment earnings of the Fund.

24 (e) The Corporation shall use the Fund to provide funding for civil legal
25 services to indigents under this title.

26 (f) The Treasurer shall:

27 (1) invest and reinvest the Fund in the same manner as other State
28 funds; and

29 (2) credit any investment earnings to the Fund and may not charge
30 interest against the Fund if the average daily net cash balance for the month is less
31 than zero.

1 (g) Expenditures from the Fund shall be made in accordance with an
 2 appropriation requested by the Judicial Branch of the State government under §
 3 7-108 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and approved by the General
 4 Assembly in the State budget or by the budget amendment procedure under § 7-208.1
 5 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 7 ~~June~~ July 1, 2013.
