- 4 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain exception for certain nonfull-time police 5 officers of the Natural Resources Police Force to the prohibition against a law 6 enforcement agency employing an individual as a certain police officer for a 7 certain period of time unless the individual is certified by the Police Training 8 Commission; declaring the intent of the General Assembly with respect to the 9 employment of nonfull-time police officers in the Natural Resources Police 10 Force; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the certification of nonfull-time police officers nonfull-time officers of the Natural 11 Resources Police Force. 12

20 21	(1) the number of nonfull—time police officers employed by the Natural Resources Police Force not exceed 15% of the total number of patrol officers; and
22 23	(2) in hiring nonfull—time police officers, the Natural Resources Police Force place the highest priority on hiring:

25	(ii) second, other retired law enforcement officers; and

29 30 31 32	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of June 30, 2019, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
