P2 3lr0401 SB 432/12 - EHE(PRE-FILED) By: Senator Young Requested: August 31, 2012 Introduced and read first time: January 9, 2013 Assigned to: Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs A BILL ENTITLED AN ACT concerning Procurement - Maryland Buy American Steel and Manufactured Goods Act FOR the purpose of altering the Maryland Buy American Steel Act to include American manufactured goods; requiring a public body to require that certain contractors and subcontractors use or supply only American manufactured goods under certain procurements; defining a term; providing for the application of this Act; requiring a public body to give a certain notice; requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt certain regulations regarding the granting of a preference for the use of American manufactured goods; and generally relating to the Maryland Buy American Steel and Manufactured Goods Act. BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Finance and Procurement Section 17–301, 17–303, 17–304, and 17–306 to be under the amended subtitle "Subtitle 3. Buy American Procurement for Public Works" Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article - State Finance and Procurement Section 17–302 and 17–305 Annotated Code of Maryland (2009 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 16 17 18 19	The Board shall adopt regulations, in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article, stating that a bid or offered price of an American steel product OR AN AMERICAN MANUFACTURED GOOD shall be considered reasonable if it does not exceed the sum of the bid or offered price of a similar steel product OR MANUFACTURED GOOD of foreign origin, including duty, plus:

21 22 23	(2) 30% of that bid or offered price if the steel product OR MANUFACTURED GOOD is produced in a "substantial labor surplus area" as defined by the United States Department of Labor.

25 26 27 28	(a) Unless a public body is satisfied that a person has completed the work in full compliance with §§ 17–303 and 17–304 of this subtitle, the public body may not pay or authorize a payment for work subject to §§ 17–303 and 17–304 of this subtitle to a person under a contract.		
29 30	(b) If a person receives a payment that should not have been made under subsection (a) of this section, the Attorney General may recover the portion of the		

payment that is attributable to work that does not comply with §§ 17-303 and 17-304

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- of this subtitle directly from the person who did not comply with §§ 17-303 and

- This subtitle may be cited as the "Maryland Buy American Steel AND MANUFACTURED GOODS Act".
