1 AN ACT concerning

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Family Law - Denial of Custody or Visitation - Sexual Abuse of a Minor

- FOR the purpose of prohibiting a court, except under certain circumstances, from awarding custody of a child or visitation with a child to a parent who has been found by a court to be guilty of a certain offense of sexual abuse of a minor; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to child custody and visitation.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) **(1)** Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, unless good cause for the award of custody or visitation is shown by clear and convincing evidence, a court may not award custody of a child or visitation with a child:
- [(1)] (I) to a parent who has been found by a court of this State to be guilty of first degree or second degree murder of the other parent of the child, another child of the parent, or any family member residing in the household of either parent of the child; or



1	[(2)] (II) to a parent who has been found by a court of any state or of
2	the United States to be guilty of a crime that, if committed in this State, would be first
3	degree murder or second degree murder of the other parent of the child, another child
4	of the parent, or any family member residing in the household of either parent of the
5	child.

- (II) TO A PARENT WHO HAS BEEN FOUND BY A COURT OF
 ANY STATE OR OF THE UNITED STATES TO BE GUILTY OF A CRIME THAT, IF
 COMMITTED IN THIS STATE, WOULD BE SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR UNDER §
 3-602 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.
- 18 (b) If it is in the best interest of the child, the court may approve a supervised visitation arrangement that assures the safety and the physiological, psychological, and emotional well—being of the child.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply only to offenses committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
