CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Utilities – Telephone Service – Charges for Directory Assistance**

3 FOR the purpose of specifying that certain residential customers are entitled to only a
4 certain number of directory assistance calls each month without charge;
5 requiring the Public Service Commission to approve other charges for directory
6 assistance, subject to a certain exception; repealing a provision that authorizes
7 the Commission to establish additional exemptions from directory assistance
8 charges; and generally relating to telephone service and directory assistance.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Public Utilities**

18 (a) (1) The Commission may not authorize telephone company charges to
19 be levied for directory assistance calls made by residential customers on the first two

1 calls made to directory assistance from each residential service per monthly billing
2 cycle.

3 (2) [The] **SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THE**
4 Commission [may] **SHALL** authorize charges on other directory assistance calls [if the
5 Commission finds, after notice and evidentiary hearing, that the charges:

6 (i) protect consumers by providing affordable and reasonably
7 priced directory assistance service;

8 (ii) encourage the development of competition; and

9 (iii) are in the public interest].

10 (b) The Commission may not authorize telephone company charges to be
11 levied for directory assistance on an individual who suffers from a physical or visual
12 disability that precludes the use of a telephone directory.

13 [(c) The Commission may provide other exemptions from telephone company
14 charges to be levied for directory assistance if the exemptions are just and reasonable.]

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
16 October 1, 2013.
