14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 19 20 21 22 23	The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws:

(A) To establish, operate, maintain, regulate and control a system of water supply and to make charges for the consumption or use of such water; to appoint watchmen or police officers for the protection of its water supply within or without the City limits.

To turn off and discontinue the supply of water furnished by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to any person or property located in or outside of the City of Baltimore because of the nonpayment of any fee or charge for water supplied or for work done in connection with the furnishing of such water until such unpaid fee or charge is fully paid; and to regulate, in or outside of the City of Baltimore, the installation of water supply service connections from the Baltimore City water supply system in such manner as to prevent the existence of cross connections between such source of supply and any private system of water supply that may exist within the premises served.

- (B) THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL MAY NOT IMPOSE ON A RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER ANY FEE OR PENALTY FOR UNPAID WATER OR SEWER USAGE CHARGES THAT EXCEED \$500 PER YEAR.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2013.
