1 AN ACT concerning

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Electrical Inspectors and Plumbing Inspectors – Master License Required

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a county or local government to employ as electrical inspectors only individuals who hold, or have previously held within a certain 4 5 period of time under certain circumstances, a State license or local license, as 6 applicable, to provide electrical services as a master electrician or who are 7 certified by certain entities; requiring a county or local government to employ as 8 plumbing inspectors only individuals who hold a master plumber license issued 9 by certain entities; providing certain exceptions to certain requirements of this 10 Act; providing for the scope of certain provisions of this Act; providing for the 11 application of this Act; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to licensing requirements for electrical inspectors and plumbing 12 inspectors. 13
