A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Safety – Emergency Management – Essential Goods and Services

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from selling or offering to sell certain goods 4 and services for a certain price during a state of emergency; prohibiting a $\mathbf{5}$ person from selling or offering to sell certain services for a certain price during a 6 state of emergency and for a certain amount of time following a state of 7 emergency; creating a certain exception; requiring the Office of the Attorney 8 General to provide a person an opportunity to present evidence that a price 9 increase was not unlawful; establishing that certain matters and allegations are confidential under certain circumstances and may not be disclosed to certain 10 persons; providing that a certain sale or offer for sale is an unfair or deceptive 11 12trade practice; altering a certain definition; defining certain terms; and 13 generally relating to the sale of goods and services during or following a state of 14emergency.

4 (F) "ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES" MEANS ANY OF THE 5 FOLLOWING, IF SPECIFIED BY CATEGORY OR BY INDIVIDUAL ITEMS IN AN 6 EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR IN CONNECTION WITH A STATE OF 7 EMERGENCY:

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(1) FOOD ITEMS;

- 10 (3) GOODS AND SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP;
- 11 (4) EMERGENCY SUPPLIES;
- 12 (5) MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT;
- 13 (6) HOME HEATING OIL;
- 14 (7) BUILDING MATERIALS;
- 15 **(8)** HOUSING;
- 16 (9) TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES;
- 17 **(10)** GASOLINE; OR

18 (11) GOODS AND SERVICES NECESSARY TO PRESERVE THE 19 HEALTH, SAFETY, OR WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.

20 (G) "FOOD ITEM" MEANS ANY ARTICLE THAT IS USED OR INTENDED FOR 21 USE FOR FOOD OR DRINK.

- 22 (H) "FUEL" MEANS GASOLINE, DIESEL, OR OTHER FUEL USED TO 23 POWER A MOTOR VEHICLE OR POWER TOOL.
- 24 (I) (1) "HOUSING" MEANS RENTAL HOUSING.

25 (2) "HOUSING" INCLUDES HOUSING PROVIDED BY A HOTEL, 26 MOTEL, OR CAMPGROUND. 1 (J) "MEDICAL SUPPLIES OR EQUIPMENT" INCLUDES PRESCRIPTION 2 AND NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS, VACCINES, BANDAGES, GAUZE, 3 ISOPROPYL ALCOHOL, MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, ANTIVIRAL PRODUCTS, AND 4 ANTIBACTERIAL PRODUCTS.

5 (K) "PRICE" MEANS RETAIL OR WHOLESALE PRICE.

6 (L) "REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES" MEANS SERVICES 7 PERFORMED BY A PERSON FOR REPAIRS TO RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL 8 PROPERTY THAT IS DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF A DISASTER OR TERRORIST 9 ATTACK.

- 10 (M) "REPLACEMENT COSTS" MEANS:
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(1) ACQUISITION COSTS;

12 (2) COSTS THAT ARE A RESULT OF A CONTRACT IN WHICH THE 13 CONSUMER GOODS AND SERVICES ARE PRICED ACCORDING TO A FORMULA 14 THAT REFERENCES PUBLISHED MARKET PRICES; OR

15 (3) THE ACTUAL OR REASONABLY CONTEMPLATED COSTS OF
16 REPLACING A GOOD OR SERVICE BEING SOLD, BASED ON INFORMATION
17 AVAILABLE AT THE TIME OF THE INCREASE IN PRICE.

18 (N) "STATE OF EMERGENCY" MEANS A STATE OF EMERGENCY 19 DECLARED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER § 14–107 OF THIS TITLE.

20 (O) "TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES" MEANS 21 SERVICES PERFORMED BY A PERSON UNDER A CONTRACT TO MOVE, STORE, OR 22 TRANSPORT PERSONAL OR BUSINESS PROPERTY OR RENT EQUIPMENT FOR 23 THOSE PURPOSES.

25(A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY, IN THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA COVERED BY THE 2627DECLARATION OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR 28OFFER TO SELL ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES SPECIFIED BY EXECUTIVE 29ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR, OTHER THAN SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP, FOR A PRICE OF MORE THAN 10% ABOVE THE HIGHEST PRICE AT 30 31WHICH THE PERSON MADE ACTUAL SALES OR RENTALS OF THOSE ESSENTIAL 32GOODS OR SERVICES NOT MORE THAN 60 DAYS OR LESS THAN 4 DAYS BEFORE 33 THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

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1 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, 2 DURING A STATE OF EMERGENCY, AND FOR THE FOLLOWING 90 DAYS, A PERSON 3 MAY NOT SELL OR OFFER TO SELL REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR 4 SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP FOR A PRICE OF MORE THAN 10% 5 ABOVE THE PRICE CHARGED BY THE PERSON FOR THOSE SERVICES 6 IMMEDIATELY BEFORE THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

7 (C) A PERSON MAY CHARGE A PRICE INCREASE OF MORE THAN 10% IF 8 THE PERSON CAN PROVE THAT:

9 (1) THE PRICE INCREASE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO
 10 ADDITIONAL COSTS IMPOSED ON THE PERSON BY THE SUPPLIER OF THE GOODS,
 11 INCLUDING REPLACEMENT COSTS; OR

12 (2) THE PRICE INCREASE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO 13 ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR LABOR OR MATERIALS USED TO PROVIDE THE 14 SERVICES OR TO PRODUCE THE GOODS, INCLUDING COSTS TO REPAIR ANY 15 DAMAGE RELATING TO THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.

16 (D) AT LEAST 20 DAYS BEFORE AN ACTION IS FILED UNDER § 14–1103 17 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL PROVIDE A 18 PERSON WHOSE ACTIONS MAY BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION NOTICE OF 19 THE GENERAL RELIEF SOUGHT BY THE OFFICE TO PROVIDE THE PERSON AN 20 OPPORTUNITY TO PRESENT EVIDENCE THAT THE PRICE INCREASE WAS IN 21 ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION.

(E) DURING THE COURSE OF AN INVESTIGATION BY THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL UNDER THIS SECTION, ANY MATTER OR ALLEGATION UNDER INVESTIGATION IS CONFIDENTIAL AND MAY NOT BE DISCLOSED TO ANYONE OUTSIDE OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OTHER THAN THE PERSON BEING INVESTIGATED OR THE PERSON'S ATTORNEY.

A SALE OR OFFER FOR SALE OF ESSENTIAL GOODS AND SERVICES THAT VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS AN UNFAIR OR DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE UNDER TITLE 13 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE, EXCEPT THAT THE REMEDIES PROVIDED UNDER § 13–411 OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE MAY NOT APPLY TO A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.

1 THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH A 2 SYSTEM BY WHICH A PERSON MAY REGISTER TO RECEIVE ELECTRONIC 3 NOTIFICATION:

4 (1) STATING THAT A STATE OF EMERGENCY HAS BEEN DECLARED 5 AND AN EXECUTIVE ORDER HAS BEEN ISSUED;

6 (2) STATING THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE ARE IN 7 EFFECT; AND

8 (3) LISTING THE CATEGORIES OR INDIVIDUAL ESSENTIAL GOODS 9 AND SERVICES THAT ARE COVERED BY THE EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE 10 GOVERNOR.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
