BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 12–101, 12–104(e), and 17–301(c)(1) Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Education Section 12–104(a) Annotated Code of Maryland (2008 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
