1 AN ACT concerning

Criminal Procedure – Bail Bonds – Cash Bail

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing in circuit courts and in the District Court cash bail or 4 cash bond to be posted by the defendant, by an individual, or by a certain $\mathbf{5}$ private surety acting for the defendant under certain circumstances; requiring 6 cash bail or cash bond to be posted by the defendant only, unless the order 7 setting bail expressly provides otherwise, in cases involving a defendant's 8 failure to pay support to certain individuals: providing for the repeal of laws 9 inconsistent with this Act; and generally relating to bail bonds in circuit courts and in the District Court. 10

5 (2) The fee shall be paid to the court as required by the rules of court 6 and shall be used to pay the expenses of carrying out this section.

7 (3) Any absolute bail bond forfeitures collected may be used to pay the 8 expenses of carrying out this section.
