11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

14 15–109.

15 (w) (1) This subsection applies only in Washington County.

16 (2) The annual salaries for the Board of License Commissioners [are:

17 (i) Chairman – \$9,850; and

18 (ii) Members – \$9,600] **SHALL BE SET BY THE BOARD OF**
 19 **COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY UNDER ARTICLE 24,**
 20 **TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THE CODE.**

21 (3) The salaries specified in this subsection are payable monthly from
 22 the license fees derived from the issuance of licenses authorized by this article.

23 (4) A member or employee of the Board may not have any pecuniary or
 24 other interest in any phase of the manufacture, sale or distribution of any alcoholic
 25 beverages.

26 **Article 24 – Political Subdivisions – Miscellaneous Provisions**

27 12–203.

28 (b) The Commission shall be comprised as follows:

29 (1) One member from the Democratic Party Central Committee of
 30 Washington County;

1 (2) One member from the Republican Party Central Committee of
2 Washington County;

3 (3) One member from the Washington County Chamber of Commerce;

4 (4) One member from the Washington County Farm Bureau;

5 (5) One member from the League of Women Voters of Washington
6 County;

7 (6) One member from the Western Maryland Central Labor Council;

8 (7) One member from the Cumberland Valley Associated Builders and
9 Contractors, Inc.;

10 (8) One member from the Joint Veterans Council of Washington
11 County; and

12 (9) One member at large **WHO IS A RESIDENT** selected by the **BOARD**
13 **OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF** Washington County [Retired Teachers
14 Association].

15 12-205.

16 (a) The Commission shall study the salaries of the Washington County:

17 (1) Board of County Commissioners;

18 (2) Board of Education;

19 (3) Orphans' Court judges;

20 (4) Sheriff;

21 (5) Treasurer; and

22 (6) Board of Liquor License Commissioners.

23 (b) (1) On or before November 20, 1996, and on or before December 1 each
24 fourth year thereafter, the Commission shall issue a report containing
25 recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners for review and consideration.

26 (2) (i) This paragraph does not apply to the salaries of the County
27 Commissioners or the Sheriff.

1 (ii) Within 45 days after receiving the recommendations of the
 2 Commission, the Board of County Commissioners shall set by local law the salary for
 3 each office included in the recommendations:

4 1. Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection; and

5 2. With respect to a public official, in accordance with Article
 6 III, § 35 of the Maryland Constitution.

7 (3) The Board of County Commissioners may accept, reduce, or reject
 8 but may not increase the recommendations of the Commission.

9 (4) On or before December 15, 1996, and on or before December 15
 10 each fourth year thereafter, the Board of County Commissioners shall submit
 11 recommendations to the legislative delegation concerning the salaries of the County
 12 Commissioners and the Sheriff.

15 (q) The County Treasurer of Washington County shall receive an annual
 16 salary [of \$6,000.00] **AS SET BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF**
 17 **WASHINGTON COUNTY UNDER ARTICLE 24, TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THE**
 18 **CODE**. The deputy treasurer and clerks shall each be paid such compensation as the
 19 said Treasurer, with the approval of the County Commissioners of said county shall
 20 determine. The County Commissioners shall pay all the office expenses of the
 21 Treasurer and shall have the power, in their discretion, to increase the compensation
 22 of the Treasurer and the employees in his office.

23 **Article – Education**

24 3–1302.

25 (a) (1) The president of the county board [is entitled to receive \$6,200
 26 annually as compensation] and the other members are entitled to receive [\$6,100 each
 27 annually as] compensation **ANNUALLY AS SET BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY**
 28 **COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY UNDER ARTICLE 24, TITLE 12,**
 29 **SUBTITLE 2 OF THE CODE**.

30 (2) Each member of the Washington County Board of Education is
 31 entitled to health insurance and to other fringe benefits regularly provided to
 32 employees of the board of education.

33 (b) After submitting vouchers, members shall be reimbursed for travel and
 34 other expenses within the limit set by the Washington County Commissioners.

1 **Article – Estates and Trusts**

2 2–108.

3 (v) (1) As compensation each of the judges of the Court for Washington
4 County shall receive an annual compensation [of not more than \$7,000 per year] **AS**
5 **SET BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY**
6 **UNDER ARTICLE 24, TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THE CODE.**

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 2013.
