(c) A person with a submerged land lease in the Chesapeake Bay may cultivate shellfish on the submerged land, in temporary protective enclosures

- 4 (d) A person with a water column lease in the waters of the State may 5 cultivate shellfish:
 - (1) Subject to approval by the United States Army Corps of Engineers, on or under the surface of the water in a floating structure; or
- 8 (2) In any other manner authorized by the Department.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
