A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Commission on the Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Passage of the**
3 **19th Amendment to the United States Constitution**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on the Commemoration of the
5 Anniversary of the Passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States
6 Constitution; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the
7 Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from receiving certain
8 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses;
9 requiring the Commission to take certain actions and make recommendations
10 regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to report its activities,
11 findings, and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or
12 before a certain date and annually thereafter for a certain period of time;
13 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the
14 Commission on the Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Passage of the
15 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution.

18 Section 9–3001 to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 30. Commission on the

23 Preamble

1 WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution giving
2 American women the right to vote was passed by both houses of the United States
3 Congress in 1919; and

4 WHEREAS, Maryland's representatives Senator Joseph I. France and
5 Congressmen William Andrews, John Linthicum, and Frederick Zihlman voted in
6 favor of the resolution that sent the proposed amendment to the states; and

7 WHEREAS, The 19th Amendment was ratified by the State of Tennessee on
8 August 18, 1920, making it the 36th state to ratify the amendment and provided the
9 final ratification necessary to enact the amendment; and

10 WHEREAS, Maryland and its citizens played an important role in the cause of
11 suffrage for women, including serving as the final stretch of the 1913 March for
12 Women's Suffrage from Newark, New Jersey, to Washington, D.C.; and

13 WHEREAS, The years 2019 through 2020 will mark the 100th anniversary of
14 the passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution; now, therefore,

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – State Government**

18 **SUBTITLE 30. COMMISSION ON THE COMMEMORATION OF THE ANNIVERSARY**
19 **OF THE PASSAGE OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES**
20 **CONSTITUTION.**

21 **9–3001.**

22 **(A) THERE IS A COMMISSION ON THE COMMEMORATION OF THE**
23 **ANNIVERSARY OF THE PASSAGE OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED**
24 **STATES CONSTITUTION.**

25 **(B) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:**

26 **(1) THE GOVERNOR, OR THE GOVERNOR'S DESIGNEE;**

27 **(2) TWO MEMBERS OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED**
28 **BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE;**

29 **(3) TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED**
30 **BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;**

1 (4) TWO MEMBERS OF THE MARYLAND COMMISSION FOR
2 WOMEN, APPOINTED BY THE CHAIR OF THE MARYLAND COMMISSION FOR
3 WOMEN;

4 (5) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF HISTORICAL AND
5 CULTURAL PROGRAMS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY
6 DEVELOPMENT, OR THE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

7 (6) THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR TOURISM, FILM, AND THE
8 ARTS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, OR
9 THE ASSISTANT SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

10 (7) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL
11 SOCIETY, OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;

12 (8) THE STATE ARCHIVIST, OR THE STATE ARCHIVIST'S
13 DESIGNEE; AND

14 (9) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:

15 (i) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN
16 VOTERS OF MARYLAND;

17 (ii) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND STATE
18 CONFERENCE OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF
19 COLORED PEOPLE;

20 (iii) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND
21 DEMOCRATIC PARTY WOMEN'S DIVERSITY LEADERSHIP COUNCIL; AND

22 (iv) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND
23 FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN.

24 (c) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIR OF THE
25 COMMISSION.

26 (d) THE MARYLAND STATE ARCHIVES SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE
27 COMMISSION.

28 (e) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:

29 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE
30 COMMISSION; BUT

1 **(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE**
2 **STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE**
3 **BUDGET.**

4 **(F) THE COMMISSION SHALL:**

5 **(1) ASSEMBLE AN INVENTORY OF SITES IN MARYLAND THAT ARE**
6 **SIGNIFICANT TO THE WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT AND THE RATIFICATION**
7 **OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION;**

8 **(2) DEVELOP A PLAN FOR COMMEMORATING THE EVENTS THAT**
9 **OCCURRED IN MARYLAND CONNECTED TO THE WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT**
10 **AND THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES**
11 **CONSTITUTION;**

12 **(3) DEVELOP A STRATEGY TO ENCOURAGE TOURISM RELATED TO**
13 **THE COMMEMORATION;**

14 **(4) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING FACILITY**
15 **DEVELOPMENT AND REPAIR RELATED TO THE COMMEMORATION;**

16 **(5) COORDINATE WITH THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LOCAL**
17 **GOVERNMENTS IN THE STATE, AND NEIGHBORING JURISDICTIONS REGARDING**
18 **THE DEVELOPMENT OF PLANS COMMEMORATING THE WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE**
19 **MOVEMENT AND THE RATIFICATION OF THE 19TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED**
20 **STATES CONSTITUTION; AND**

21 **(6) IF APPROPRIATE, RECEIVE TESTIMONY FROM AND CONSULT**
22 **WITH INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE KNOWLEDGEABLE REGARDING THE ISSUES OF**
23 **INTEREST TO THE COMMISSION.**

24 **(G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2014, AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER**
25 **FOR THE FOLLOWING 5 YEARS, THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS**
26 **ACTIVITIES, FINDINGS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN**
27 **ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE**
28 **GENERAL ASSEMBLY.**

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 July 1, 2013. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and 4 months and, at the
31 end of October 31, 2020, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
32 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
