SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

U.S. Constitution – Article V Amendments Convention – State Approval of Federal Debt Increases

FOR the purpose of applying to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention called under Article V of the U.S. Constitution, on the application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, to propose an amendment to the U.S. Constitution requiring approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states to increase the federal debt; and generally relating to an application to Congress for a convention to propose an amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

WHEREAS, Article V of the U.S. Constitution provides authority for a convention to be called by the U.S. Congress for the purpose of proposing amendments to the U.S. Constitution upon application of two–thirds of the legislatures of the several states; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland favors the proposal and ratification of an amendment to the U.S. Constitution providing that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That, as provided for in Article V of the U.S. Constitution, the General Assembly of Maryland respectfully applies to the U.S. Congress for an amendments convention to be called for the purpose of proposing an amendment to the U.S. Constitution providing that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the amendments convention contemplated by this application shall be entirely focused on and exclusively limited to the subject matter of proposing for ratification an amendment to the U.S. Constitution providing that an



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1	increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the
2	separate states; and be it further

- RESOLVED, That this application constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the U.S. Constitution until at least two—thirds of the legislatures of the several states have made application for an equivalently limited amendments convention; and be it further
- RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution under the Great Seal of the State of 8 Maryland be sent by the Secretary of State to:
- 9 (1) the President of the United States Senate and the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; and
- 11 (2) all members of the Maryland Congressional Delegation; and be it 12 further
 - RESOLVED, That, under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, the Secretary of State is directed to send copies of this Joint Resolution to the presiding officers of both Houses of the legislature of each of the several states, with the request that it be circulated among leaders in the legislative branch of the state governments; and with the further request that each of the states join in requesting the U.S. Congress to call a constitutional convention for the purpose of initiating a proposal to amend the U.S. Constitution as described in this Joint Resolution.
