The Vestry of the Holy Trinity Parish is the grantee organization applying for the bond bill to support construction of an air-supported Arts and Athletic Center. This Center will serve the students (current enrollment of 546) of Holy Trinity Episcopal Day School. The School (preschool through grade 8) is firmly committed to the education of all children and does not discriminate on the basis of race, religion or ethnic origin. Education at the School is about connecting ideas and enriching the development of the whole child academically, artistically, and athletically. Our students are given ample opportunities to participate in music and drama. The School believes that an education that includes the performing arts offers a rich learning environment. We support experiential learning and instruction outside the traditional classroom setting. Each student in the Middle School participates in at least one of five bands (cadet, concert, symphonic, jazz and wind ensemble) and is offered the opportunity to join the drama club that stages two productions annually. The athletic program offers basketball, soccer, cross-country and track, cheer-leading,

and flag football both at the interscholastic and intramural levels.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Arts and Athletic Center (AAC) will cover 19,456 square feet, comprising of 2 basketball courts, 2 volley ball courts, 2 locker rooms (with 48 lockers), 1 office, 2 bathrooms, and 4 bleachers. A PA system and scoreboards will also be part of the Center. This structure will allow our students to participate in physical education regardless of inclement weather, to stage performing arts productions, serve our athletic teams (basketball, volleyball, soccer, indoor track, and cheer-leading), be a gathering space for all-school assemblies and expand our Extended Day and Summer Camp programs as there will be ample room space for organized activities. The space will allow us to raise the athletic skills of our students to a more competitive level and showcase their musical and dramatic talent in a large setting. With the increased seating available, we can welcome the community to join us in celebrating the artistic and athletic talent of our students. We expect to employ 5 additional staff to oversee the implementation of these events. Youth sports in PG county is on the rise and there is a need for more venues for indoor sports. Our AAC will serve as a viable option for other local athletic and community events on a year-round basis.
