A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws – Passing a Bicycle, an Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device, or a Motor Scooter – Distance Requirement

FOR the purpose of altering the distance that the driver of a vehicle is required to maintain, except under certain circumstances, when passing a bicycle, an electric personal assistive mobility device (EPAMD), or a motor scooter; making conforming changes; and generally relating to bicycles, EPAMDs, and motor scooters.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, the driver of a vehicle19 shall:
- 20 (1) Exercise due care to avoid colliding with any bicycle, EPAMD, or 21 motor scooter being ridden by a person; and

1 (2) When overtaking a bicycle, an EPAMD, or a motor scooter, pass 2 safely at a distance of not less than [3] 4 feet, unless, at the time:

3 (i) The bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider fails to operate 4 the vehicle in conformance with § 21–1205(a) of this subtitle ("Riding to right side of 5 roadway") or § 21–1205.1(b) of this subtitle ("Roadway with bike lane or shoulder 6 paved to smooth surface");

7 (ii) A passing clearance of less than [3] 4 feet is caused solely by
8 the bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter rider failing to maintain a steady course; or

9 (iii) The highway on which the vehicle is being driven is not wide
10 enough to lawfully pass the bicycle, EPAMD, or motor scooter at a distance of at least
11 [3] 4 feet.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2014.
