2 **Procurement Advisory Council – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of adding the Secretary of Information Technology as a member of  
4 the Procurement Advisory Council; and generally relating to the Procurement  
5 Advisory Council.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

2 (b) There is a Procurement Advisory Council.

3 (c) (1) The Council consists of the following [ten] **11** members:

4 (i) the State Treasurer;

5 (ii) the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland;

6 (iii) the Secretary of Budget and Management;

7 (iv) the Secretary of General Services;

8 (v) **THE SECRETARY OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY;**

9 **(VI)** the Secretary of Transportation;

10 **[(vi)] (VII)** the Secretary of the Board;

11 **[(vii)] (VIII)** the Special Secretary for the Office of Minority  
12 Affairs;

13 **[(viii)] (IX)** a representative of local government who has  
14 expertise in local procurement matters, appointed by the Governor with the advice and  
15 consent of the Senate; and

16 **[(ix)] (X)** two members of the general public, at least one of  
17 whom has expertise in State procurement matters, appointed by the Governor with  
18 the advice and consent of the Senate.

19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
20 July 1, 2014.
