## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Montgomery County – Town of Kensington – Alcoholic Beverages – Special**  
3 **B–K Licenses**

4 **MC 15–14**

5 FOR the purpose of altering the description of commercial areas in the Town of  
6 Kensington in Montgomery County in which the Board of License  
7 Commissioners may issue special B–K alcoholic beverages licenses for use on  
8 the premises of restaurants located in those areas; and generally relating to  
9 alcoholic beverages in the Town of Kensington in Montgomery County.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
11 Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages  
12 Section 8–216(a)(2)(iv)  
13 Annotated Code of Maryland  
14 (2011 Replacement Volume and 2013 Supplement)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

18 8–216.

19 (a) (2) (iv) 1. In the town of Kensington, the Montgomery County  
20 Board of License Commissioners may issue a special B–K beer and wine license or a  
21 special B–K beer, wine and liquor license for use on the premises of a restaurant  
22 located in the following commercial areas:

23 A. The west side of Connecticut Avenue between  
24 Knowles Avenue and Perry Avenue;

1 B. The east side of Connecticut Avenue between Knowles  
2 Avenue and Dupont Street and between University Boulevard and Perry Avenue;

3 C. The west side of University Boulevard West;

4 D. Dupont Avenue, west of Connecticut Avenue;

5 E. Plyers Mill Road, west of Metropolitan Avenue;

6 F. Summit Avenue between Knowles Avenue and  
7 Howard Avenue;

8 G. Detrick Avenue between Knowles Avenue and  
9 Howard Avenue;

10 H. The southwest side of Metropolitan Avenue between  
11 North Kensington Parkway and Plyers Mill Road;

12 I. East Howard Avenue;

13 J. Armory Avenue between Howard Avenue and  
14 Knowles Avenue;

15 K. Montgomery Avenue between Howard Avenue and  
16 Kensington Parkway; [or]

17 L. Kensington Parkway and Frederick Avenue, from  
18 Montgomery Avenue to Silver Creek; OR

19 **M. 10401 CONNECTICUT AVENUE.**

20 2. A special B–K beer, wine and liquor license or a  
21 special B–K beer and wine license authorizes the holder to keep for sale and sell  
22 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises only.

23 3. A licensee shall maintain average daily receipts from  
24 the sale of food, not including carryout food, of at least 50% of the overall average daily  
25 receipts.

26 4. In addition to the restrictions in subsubparagraphs 2  
27 and 3 of this subparagraph, the holder of a special B–K beer and wine license or a  
28 special B–K beer, wine and liquor license in the commercial areas specified in  
29 subsubparagraph 1I, J, K, and L of this subparagraph may not serve alcoholic  
30 beverages after 11 p.m.

1           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
2    July 1, 2014.
