1 3. A licensee shall maintain average daily receipts from 2 the sale of food, not including carryout food, of at least 50% of the overall average daily 3 receipts.

4 4. In addition to the restrictions in subsubparagraphs 2 5 and 3 of this subparagraph, the holder of a special B-K beer and wine license or a 6 special B-K beer, wine and liquor license in the commercial areas specified in 7 subsubparagraph 1I, J, K, and L L, AND M of this subparagraph may not serve 8 alcoholic beverages after 11 p.m.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 July 1, 2014.
